## **Speaker Bio**

### **Don Watson**

Don was one of the original players to start playing lacrosse in Nova Scotia prior to the 1969 Summer Games in Halifax. He is an analytical goaltender who, during the start-up years of lacrosse in Nova Scotia, played, coached and refereed. Don's hard work has paid off over the years as evidenced by the MVP and outstanding player awards in his trophy case. He also served as President of his association. By the early 1970s, Don was running free lacrosse schools during the summer for both boys and girls.

Don carried his love for the sport to the next level when he was drafted to the pros in 1975. Under the tutelage of one of the great coaches in lacrosse (Jim Bishop), Don set out on a new path, as a coach, relaying methods and techniques to the teams and players he coached in Nova Scotia and Alberta.

Upon moving to British Columbia, Don contributed to development of the CLA Goaltenders Manual. After working on this manual, Don realized that there was a need for more training material for goaltenders. Over the past five years, he has been developing Goaltending Levels 1 through V11. Don has taken this material and coordinated goaltender clinics in BC, Alberta and Nova Scotia. Most recently Don has been developing Shooter Level 1 material along with Modified Yearly Planning Instruments for Midget Goalies aspiring to be drafted to Junior Lacrosse. Don is currently working on a series of goaltender training videos that will soon be made available on the CLA website.

### **Bruce Codd**

Bruce brings a wealth of lacrosse experience as he has been playing the game for over 25 years and is currently the Head Coach of the Junior A Calgary Raiders. He is an NLL veteran of 11 seasons and is currently a member of the Calgary Roughnecks, where he was a part of the 2009 Champions Cup winning team. His impressive resume includes two Minto Cups while playing for Orangeville, two Mann Cups with Brampton and another Minto Cup in 2008 as an Assistant Coach with Orangeville.

## **James Gow**

Born in Montréal Quebec, James grew up in Peterborough Ontario, went to school at Queen's in Kingston, Ontario, and now lives in Victoria, British Columbia. He has three grown children. James works as a physiotherapist in Victoria and has served as the CLA Coaching Sector Chair since 2009.

James was introduced to lacrosse in the Peterborough Minor Lacrosse School. He went on to play professionally for Montréal and Québec, played junior in Peterborough, and senior lacrosse in Peterborough, Nanaimo, and Victoria. James has been involved with coaching or managing lacrosse teams since 1973, including over twenty minor lacrosse teams, provincial teams from BC and Canada's Men's U19 field teams. James is currently an assistant coach with the Victoria Shamrocks Intermediate team.

## **Duane Bratt**

Duane Bratt is the National Resource Person for coaching at the Canadian Lacrosse Association and is also Chair of the LTAD technical committee.

Duane has been involved in lacrosse since 1974 as a player, coach, referee, and administrator in both box and men's field. He is currently head coach of the Calgary Sr. Mountaineers and the Calgary Senior Men's Field Lacrosse team. In 2009, he was awarded the James McFall Trophy as a life member of the Alberta Lacrosse Association.

## **Terry Harding**

Terry grew up and played minor box lacrosse in London Ontario, played junior lacrosse in London and senior for the Windsor Warlocks and the Edmonton Blues. Along the way he discovered field lacrosse, playing a year for the Toronto Lacrosse Club and volunteering at the 1986 ILF senior Men's Field World Championship in Toronto.

After a hiatus, Terry returned to lacrosse in 1997, when he started refereeing field lacrosse and coaching the Saskatchewan provincial senior men's field lacrosse team. In 5 trips to the CLA senior men's championship he had a record of only 1 loss, winning a silver medal in 1997 followed by 4 gold medals.

Officiating has become his passion. A FIL certified referee, a CLA level 5 field referee and a NOCP clinician, Terry is currently a member of the Federation of International Lacrosse men's rules committee. He was a member of the CLA committee selecting referees for both the 2008 and 2010 World championships. Internationally, he has refereed in Netherlands and the USA, was an assessor at the 2006 and 2008 World Championships and at the 2008 European Championship. Terry will be in



Manchester this summer as an assessor. Nationally, Terry has served as RIC or assistant RIC at several CLA national field championships and has refereed at numerous CLA national field championships.
